- ✓ What's the involvement of the city?
- ✓ What's the involvement of big companies?
- ✓ What's the intention of the project?
- ✓ How is info about the project disseminated?
- ✓ How is the message handled/framed?
- ✓ How is the community responding to the project?
- ✓ How are local businesses involved?
- ✓ How does this project fit into priorities identified by the community?
- ✓ What is the total budget? What are the line item expenses?
- ✓ Where is the money coming from?
- ✓ How does the project connect to other community resources, projects, needs, etc?
- ✓ How is the project being made culturally relevant?
- ✓ How are the police involved in this project?
